Sermon Discussion Questions: 2 Samuel 11

What stands out to you most about David's fall in this story?

How does his descent into sin challenge or reshape your assumptions about who is "safe" from moral failure?

The sermon described sin as both something we do and something we are.

How do you see that distinction play out in your own life, particularly in ways that surprise or unsettle you?

How does isolation increase the danger of sin, according to the sermon and David's example?

What practices or relationships in your life help guard against isolation?

Why do you think we so often try to cover up or manage sin ourselves, instead of confessing it or seeking help?

What fears drive that response, and what does this story show about where that path leads?

The sermon said we need a hero bigger than ourselves to deal with sin.

What does it look like in daily life to trust in Jesus as that hero, rather than trusting in our willpower or morality?
